The book, "The Farmer's Bride Collection", has six romance stories written by six different authors. The stories are about farmers but also about hearts, homes and harvests.

"One Little Prayer"

This story is about Louanne, 9 years old, who prays for someone to call "Dad". She believes she finds him, but something is not quite right.

"The Tie That Binds"

Between 1854 and 1930 orphaned or abandoned children, usually in crowded East coast cities, traveled on orphan trains from the East coast to the West hoping to find new homes. The book centers on telling Emma's "placing-out" experience.

"A Homesteader, a Bride, and a Baby"

All of Lorette's family died from diphtheria but for an infant nephew. (Diphtheria is a serious, potentially life-threatening bacterial infection, mainly affecting the nose and throat). Lorette is destitute but determined to care for herself and her nephew child alone if necessary.

• "The Applesauce War"

Two fathers believe a conflict between them will bring their daughter and son together. It does become a real conflict that has the children bewildered.

"Sunshine Harvest"

After her father's sudden death Anne is left to determine if and how to run the citrus farm as the fruit is ready for picking. The future of Anne, her mother, the farm-hands and their families are in her hands.

"New Beginnings"

Betsy marries but is living a lie. How can she hide her secret from her husband? They are moving West to Ohio. Can she hide her lie there?

This book is a true story about a prolific writer of Christian novels, her genealogy, and the life she led as a child, student, and college graduate. She married her college sweetheart who became a minister, and they raised four children. She also worked in a bank, conducted her preacher's wife duties, and started writing her books. Janette traveled to many cities for book signings, to give speeches, and to occasionally teach classes.

She received many awards for her books which were featured in numerous magazines. Her books were also published in a multitude of languages. She has sold over 10 million copies of her books.

Her daughter Laurel writes about her family's history saying her mother's relatives came from England to America in the 1600s. Her father's relatives came to America in 1766 by way of Canada from Germany. All were pioneers and led the hard physical lives of the times.

Janette's books continue to be written and are popular in Christian literature, especially life $_{5}$ on the prairies.
