### **Accomplishments/Successes for the Year:**

Led the first group of church leadership through Ignition Point in the Fall.

Finished my dissertation and submitted it to the review committee right before Thanksgiving. I should be graduating in May 2023.

Officiated at 6 baptisms.

Helped guide 8 families through their grief and officiated at either graveside or in-person Celebrations of Life. This included my own father-in-law's service in November.

### **Challenges:**

Self-care: came down with COVID in May, gave it to Diana, and then dealt with COVID fatigue through the summer months of June, July, and August.

Growing for God Building Campaign - working with Jill and Larry for the loan as well as for a contractor to build the buildings.

Stewardship: encouraging the congregation to give during the current economic crisis.

### **Objectives for Next Year (2023):**

**Growth in attendance**: working with the Worship Planning Team to provide worship services that meet the needs of our current attendees as well as attract new and younger people and families. Currently working with Chaz Ross to find an acoustic guitar player to help lead with worship to provide a **blended worship** experience of traditional hymns and praise music. The challenge is finding someone to do it initially for **free** as we don't have a lot of extra in the budget. I am also currently working with Andrea Isaac and Insio Che, who are local violin and piano teachers, to open our church for their recitals on a regular, perhaps, monthly basis. Insio's daughter attends AGC, and Andrea is Even Tjioe's viola teacher. I am also working with them to provide their students to come and get performance experience by playing in worship on Sunday. It is my prayer that this will help to attract new attendees.

I also believe that we should host at least 5 outreach events geared to get people to the church and comfortable in attending at a time other than Sunday morning. I will work with Connie B. as well as anyone else to help coordinate these events. Besides potlucks on Sunday after church, I would like us to host a few movie nights during the Summer and into the Fall as well. Other than that, I am wide open to ideas.

Men's Breakfast: We will be hosting an AGC/DCPC Men's Breakfast Planning Meeting on Saturday, January 21 at 8:00 am. My prayer is that I get a good number of Dad's from AGC to attend so that we can combine leadership between the church and the school. Larry Hengl has agreed to be our first speaker for our February meeting, highlighting the Growing for God Building Campaign as well as our solar project.

Grief Seminar: With so much grief within the church, school, and community, I am currently working on presenting a Grief seminar in in-person first, and then on Zoom. I don't have the dates set yet as I am just reading the material needed to present one. We have lost 19 members/ attendees since 2020, so grief is prevalent in our church. But COVID also brought about grief, not only in our church and school but also in the community. It is time for it to be addressed.

DCPC/AGC Interest Survey: I just recently sent out a Google Form survey to not only DCPC but also AGC. This survey was created by Connie Beeby, Diana Schoonover, and myself. It asks about their interest in worship services, with the possibility of expanding beyond just a Sunday morning service. Therefore, the inclusion of an acoustic guitar player for Sunday morning is so important. An extra service would, most likely, be more praise music-oriented than our current Sunday morning service. It also asks if there is interest in my leading Bible studies for AGC families and what the possible topics may be. This leads to one final idea that I want to explore for 2023.

If we are going to be increasing the usage of the Sanctuary, we will need to address the elephant in the room, which is the wall between the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall. We had four events in December that filled the sanctuary. We had a recital, two AGC Christmas concerts, as well as our Christmas Eve service that were very close to needing extra space. We had 140 at one of these events. The other three were well over 120. I would like to propose that we tear down the wall and replace it with a folding wall, that uses the panels. I have no idea of the cost, but I can research that if you want or need me to. This would provide us with the ability to host larger events and still be able to have two separate rooms when we need them.

**Attracting young families**: This will be accomplished by reviving the Sunday School and Youth Programs. I am meeting with John McMillan (our CLP) and Tristin Airola (our Christian Education Coordinator) on January 16<sup>th</sup> to go over our current curriculum and map out a course of action to meet the needs of kids. Also, I will work with Tristin to connect more with the families that do attend and the AGC families that have indicated an interest in attending.

Pizza with the Rev (a.k.a. DCPC Youth Group) will meet once a month for the rest of this school year. We will assess how things are in May to see if we need/can add more meetings. Currently have 4 in attendance. Working with PCUSA youth material for our study time and feeding them lunch right after church. That time was picked to work best with their schedules right now. Open invitation to have them bring their friends as well.

I will also attend every AGC event, as I always do, and continually invite people to come and worship with us on Sunday at 10:00 am.

Commissioned Lay Pastor - According to the commissioning agreement I am John's supervisor for the three-year commissioning contract. John's areas of responsibility are worship and Christian Education. John is not a free pulpit supply. Over the course of this year, I will be working with John to assist me on Communion Sundays. There was no "practical" training for the CLPs on how to officiate at the Lord's Table, officiate at funerals, weddings, etc. So, part of our work will be helping to build John's competencies in these worship areas. I am excited to be working with John. As John taught Sunday School for many years, John will be overseeing our Christian Education program. That means that our Christian Education Coordinators (right now just Tristin) will report directly to John. I plan on meeting with John on a bi-weekly basis, for now, to help him develop an active and effective Christian Education program.

#### Other Comments:

COVID and the months following taught me a valuable lesson, that being self-care. Over the course of 2023 I will continue meeting with my Spiritual Director, Carl Grant, monthly. This helps me to stay spiritually centered. I have two pastor retreats that I plan on attending in April and October (study leave), as well as my graduation in May.

8:00 a.m. - Breakfast. (we are still looking for someone to cook breakfast)


8:30 a.m. - A short business meeting.


8:40 a.m. - Guest speaker; Q & A to follow.
